

- * Taste the famous Ionia Cherry Liqueur at the Ionia Cherry Farm.
- * See 'The Gumtree', the tallest sandstone structure in the world.

Overnight - Clarens.

DAY 4: CLARENS / PHUTHADITJHABA / CLARENS (170km)

Keep on exploring the outskirts of Clarens and take a drive to Phuthaditjhaba for the day.

- * Walk to the top of the 850m high Tugela Falls on the Sentinel Hiking

TABLE MOUNTAIN CABLEWAY

Board the state of the art cable car transportation system for a five-minute scenic ride to the top of Table Mountain, one of the world's New7Wonders of Nature. Relax and enjoy refreshments on top of Table Mountain at one of the food and beverage outlets.

TWO OCEANS AQUARIUM (V&A WATERFRONT)

Experience the incredible diversity of marine life found in the Indian and Atlantic Oceans at this top tourist attraction. 
AFROGEM (CAPE TOWN)

SEGWAY TOURS AT SPIER




TSITSIKAMMA CANOPY TOURS


SAFARI OSTRICH SHOW FARM (OUDTSHOORN)



RIVER RAFTING ON THE VAAL RIVER (PARYS)



WHITE WATER RAFTING ON THE SABIE RIVER (NEAR HAZYVIEW)

Step into a two man inflatable raft and paddle your way, under the watchful eye of a qualified guide, through the rapids of the Sabie River with its abundance of bird life and lush indigenous forest scenes. You will even get the chance to "bum slide" half way at the picnic stop.

QUAD BIKE TRAILS - THE SABIE RIVER VALLEY (NEAR HAZYVIEW)


THE PANORAMA ROUTE (FROM HAZYVIEW)
